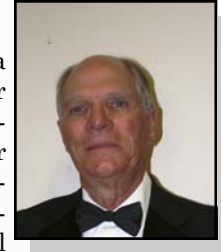

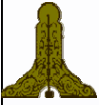

From The Yest

I had the opportunity to attend the Grand Lodge Leadership Academy last month and would like to share one of the topics we discussed: Generation gaps in our Lodges.

Masonry has ridden the wave of public necessity for generations. The last big swell occurred after Vietnam. The Soldiers who returned for war longed for the feeling of brotherhood they experienced while at war. Masonry filled that need. In the mid 1970s, in would seem, we entered a trough, a dry spell in interest. It is apparent that that dry spell is over. What we are experiencing now is a tri-generation conundrum.

Essentially, we have three generations in our Lodge: For simplicities sake we will call them the post-WW2 generation, the post-Vietnam generation, and the current generations. These are not the correct, accepted, terms but will work for our purposes. The leadership academy defined these generations in terms of how they tend to act, and what motivates them but stopped short of explaining how they can work together; For we must work together to survive.

The post-WW2 and post-Vietnam generations share more in common they then have in differences. They are driven by a since of duty (first), and a since of getting things done along established lines. They believe that the collective advancement is more important than any individual honor. They are fiercely loyal. These men are the back-

bone of our society in and out of Lodge. They are the institutional knowledge of our Lodge. They are our past masters, our past grand masters, and our DDGLs.

The current generation is the future. They differ from the previous generations in that they are not bound by conventional thinking. They don't necessarily accept tried and true methods of getting things done as the best or only way of doing things. They are more independent, and desire opportunities to stand out from the crowd. They are individuals who can work as part of a team, but desire their own area of responsibility in the team.

For our Lodges to survive we must bridge these groups. To succeed, both groups must put forth the effort. The current generation must open themselves up. They need to realize that even though they see a need for change, they can't try and do it all at once. This overwhelms the post-war generations who are comfortable with things they way they are. Likewise, the post-war guys need to realize that the current generation is not trying to usurp the primary tenants of Freemasonry, the rich historical lessons, or the customs. They are all, in truth, moving in the same direction on parallel roads.

Masonry is a business, and our product is brotherhood. To

Brotherhood in War

The Battle of Sharpsburg (Antietam to the Union) was the single bloodiest day of fighting ever during the bitter War for Southern Independence. More than 23,000 men were killed or wounded. During this horrible and bloody battle, numerous instances occurred that showed the enduring nature of Brotherly Love and Relief in times of trouble. On the morning following the battle, Confederate sharpshooters fired at anything that moved. A wounded Confederate handed a Union sentry a piece of cloth on which the Square and Compass was crudely drawn in blood. The sentry carried it to a captain who recognized the Masonic emblem. The captain told the Colonel that a wounded Confederate needed help. The Colonel asked for volunteers and several Masons offered to help. At the risk of their lives they went to and carried the fallen Lieutenant of the Alabama Volunteers to the 5th New Hampshire field hospital. The Lieutenant told them about another Mason lying wounded in the cornfield. Back they went and carried him to join the other enemy soldier. Both men received the same treatment, as did the Federal wounded from the camp surgeon, a Freemason, Dr. William Child. These were men who truly remembered their

obligation to never hesitate to go out of their way to raise a fallen Brother.

Confederate Masons no less than their Union counterparts remembered the obligations of the Craft in the midst of war. The Federal gunboat *USS Albatross*, under the command of John Hart hurled shell after shell into the village of St. Francisville, Louisiana. Later, the crew sent a small boat under a flag of truce to the shore. The executive officer asked for a Mason. The Senior Warden of Feliciana Lodge No. 31, W. W. Leake, answered the call. When informed that Captain Hart, who was a Freemason, was dead, Brother Leake immediately offered to open his Lodge and bury Hart with Masonic rites.

Over the years the United Daughters of the Confederacy kept his grave fresh and green. In 1972 the Grand Lodge of Louisiana replaced the simple headstone with a monument that covered Hart's entire grave. The monument was engraved: "This monument is dedicated in loving tribute to the universality of Freemasonry."



Question of the Month

The question in our January newsletter was: What is the Twenty-fifth Landmark of Freemasonry and its meaning? The unwritten laws (landmarks) are derived from the ancient and universal customs which date back to a remote period that we have no record of their origin (Mackey). The Masonic conception of a landmark is fundamental law of Masonry which no body of men or Masons can repeal. The answer then to the twenty-fifth landmark is that they are unchangeable, and the meaning is, even in today's society of Masons, no organization has the power to make changes. Even some Grand Lodges will not, have not adopted the landmarks of Masonry because they can not be changed.

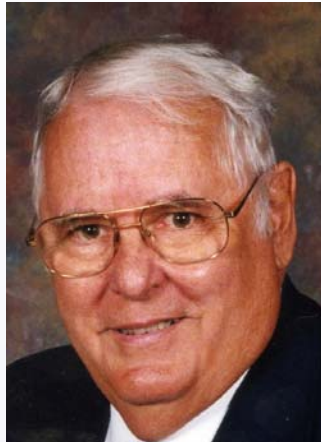

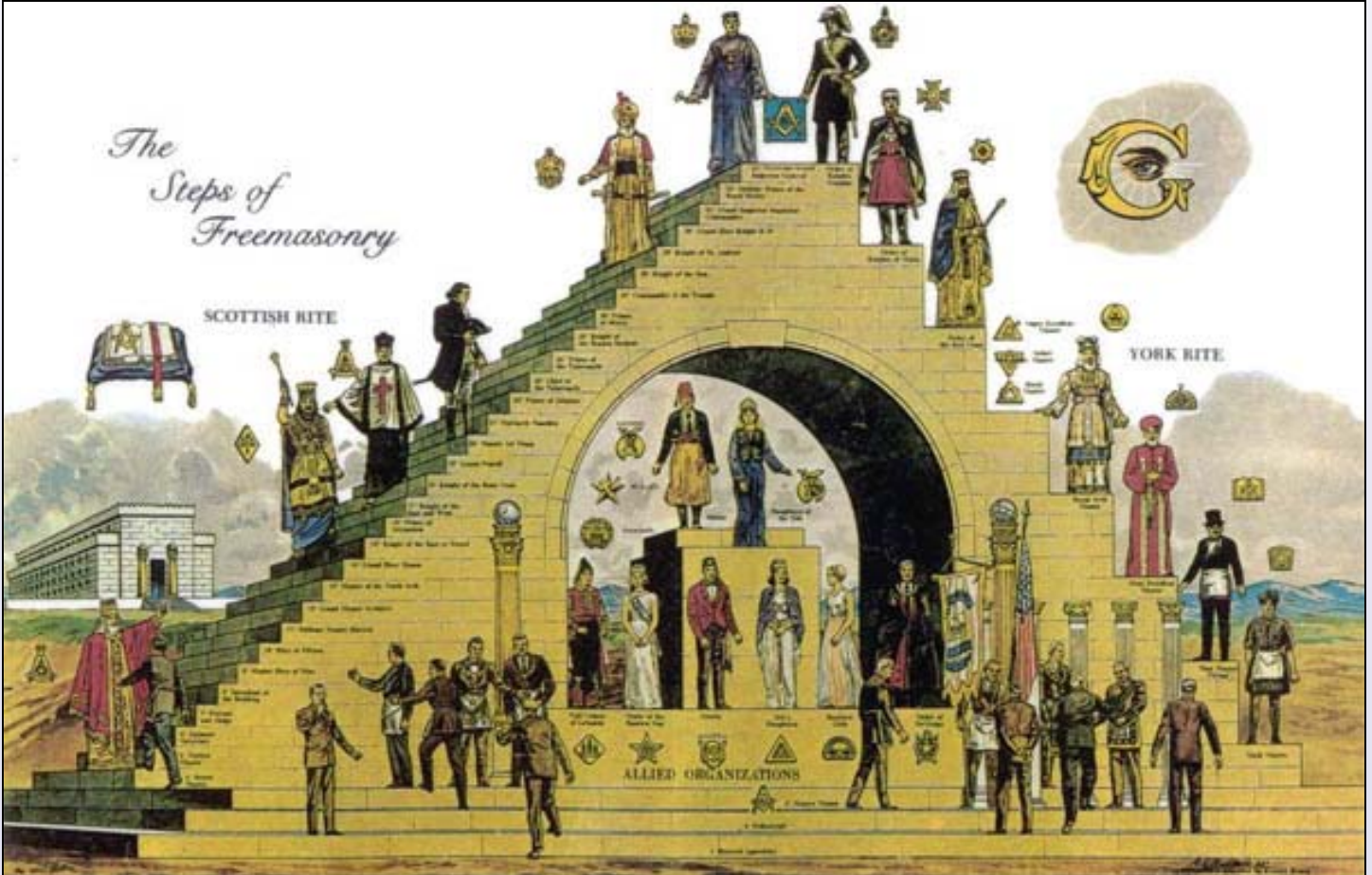
