WHAT IS THE THIRTY-THIRD DEGREE? (Scottish Rite Mason)

This is the highest or official degree which can only be granted and conferred by the Supreme Council. It cannot be applied for. Each year at the annual meeting of the Supreme Council, a member of Thirty-second Degree Masons from throughout the Jurisdiction, are elected to receive the Thirty-third Degree because of outstanding service to the Fraternity or for service to others which reflect credit upon the Order. Nominations for the Thirty-third Degree are made by the Deputies of each of the Districts after consultation with their fellow Active members in each District. Nominations are then submitted to the entire Active Membership of the Supreme Council for ballot. Following election, candidates await the next annual meeting when the Degree is conferred in full ceremonial form

THE DEGREE STRUCTURE OF SCOTTISH RITE MASONRY

The Lodge of Perfection - 4th degree thru the 14 degree. The Council - 15th degree thru the 16 degree. The Chapter - 17th degree thru the 18 degree. The Consistory - 19th degree thru the 32 degree.

The Scottish Rite shares the belief of all Masonic organizations that there is no higher degree than that of the third degree Master Mason.

The Cochise Scottish Rite Club is responsible of conferring twice each year at least eight degrees providing that we have enough Scottish Rite Masons. If you are interested in
